### Shoot details

**Venue:** The Stanley Turner Ground, Kingston Road, Lewes, East Sussex, BN7 3NB.

**Round:** GNAS Double One Way Clout.

**Juniors:** Distances according to GNAS age groups. Juniors may shoot the senior distances and participate as seniors.

**Entry fee:** £5.50. **Closing date:** 22<sup>nd</sup> May, 2010. No refunds after this date.

**Sighters:** 11.00 am.

**Arrows:** the use of all carbon arrows is not permitted at this venue. All lost arrows must be located before the field is vacated.

**Liability:** Sussex County Archery Association, its members, Lewes District Council and its staff cannot accept liability or responsibility for any loss or injury howsoever caused.

**Rules of shooting:** GNAS Rules of Shooting will apply.

**Eligibility:** this shoot is open to individuals affiliated to GNAS or a FITA member association. You must produce proof of membership for inspection if requested.

**Dress code:** This is a UK Record Status Shoot. GNAS rule 307 requires plain white, plain dark green or your registered club colours. And note the new rule sandals and open-ended shoes.

**Drug testing:** Record Status Shoots are subject to Drug testing. Refusal to provide a sample for drug testing if requested will be treated as a positive result. A parent or guardian must consent to their child being tested by signing their entry form and explain the implications of drug testing to their child.

**Photography:** in accordance with the Archery GB Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy, anyone wishing to take photographs must register with the Tournament Organiser on arrival at the venue. Unauthorised photography or filming is prohibited.

**Safety:** GNAS rules of shooting require that everybody taking part in a Clout Tournament must have received instruction in Clout Shooting. Please take this to mean *Practical Instruction* that includes shooting Clout distances, not just verbal instruction or reading. Compound archers in particular must know how to aim their bows safely.
